**MORE KIDS AT RISK OF GOING HUNGRY THIS SUMMER**  
**Summer Food Service Site Observation at YMCA**

**What:**

Summer can be especially difficult for the nearly 160,000 Clark County School District (CCSD) children who receive many of their primary meals at school. This summer, with the elimination of the year-round school schedule, an additional 65,000 children will be at risk of going hungry.

Three Square Food Bank and its partners aim to double the amount of food provided this summer over last through participation in the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP).

Southern Nevada’s Summer Food Service Program is a collaborative effort between Three Square Food Bank, the Culinary Training Academy (CTA), SFSP sponsors, SFSP sites like YMCA and the CCSD among others, to ensure that our community’s children receive the nutrition they need during summer break. Funded by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and administered by Nevada’s Department of Education, there are feeding sites in Henderson and Las Vegas this summer providing free meals to children in need.

Please join us for summer food service observation at Bill & Lillie Heinrich YMCA, an open food service site. Youth ages 2-18 can receive a free lunch at the Heinrich YMCA now through August 26, Monday through Friday, 11:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. The Bill & Lillie Heinrich YMCA is the only local YMCA participant.

A national model project inspired by Eric Hilton with a grant provided by the Conrad N. Hilton Foundation, Three Square is a community collaborative partnership with the gaming industry, businesses, non-profit agencies, food distributors, higher education institutions, the CCSD, governmental entities, the media and thousands of volunteers to efficiently and effectively serve hope to those in our community struggling with hunger. Three Square currently provides more than 22 million pounds of food and grocery product – the equivalent of nearly 16 million meals – per year to more than 600 Program Partners including non-profit and faith-based organizations, schools and feeding sites throughout Southern Nevada.
