**YMCA of Southern Nevada Offers Cool Camps, Sizzlin' Summer Pass**  
*Families can choose from dozens of affordable day camps, get unlimited water park access*

**Las Vegas** – The YMCA of Southern Nevada offers budget-friendly solutions for families looking for quality childcare, refreshing entertainment and ways to stay active this summer. Day camp registrations and sales of Sizzlin' Summer Passes – offering unlimited access to the YMCA's three water parks – are now under way at the Bill & Lillie Heinrich YMCA, 4141 Meadows Lane; The City of Las Vegas Durango Hills Community Center YMCA, 3521 N. Durango Drive and The City of Las Vegas Centennial Hills Community Center YMCA, 6601 N. Buffalo Drive.

YMCA Day Camp for boys and girls ages 5 to 15 runs June 7 through August 27, Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. To accommodate parents' schedules, the YMCA provides free care for campers from 7 to 9 a.m. and 4 to 6 p.m. Youth can choose from a variety of traditional and specialty camps, including rock climbing, abracadabra magic, cooking kids, basketball, scrapbooking, glamour girls, science gone wild and dozens more. Camp includes structured YMCA activities like swimming, arts and crafts, group games, gym time and character development.

Weekly camp prices range from about \$100 to \$200, and a daily drop-in rate of \$45 is available. No one is turned away because of an inability to pay. Financial assistance is available.

"Kids make friends and memories at Y Day Camp. Parents love the price and convenience," said Mike Lubbe, YMCA President and CEO. "Parents can register the kids for a week, several weeks or the whole summer."

Back by popular demand is the YMCA Sizzlin' Summer Pass, which includes four months of fun at just \$99 for an individual or \$199 for a family. Sizzlin' Summer Pass holders get unlimited access to the YMCA's three water parks, complete with multi-story flume slides, sparkling pools and aqua play zones. The pass comes with YMCA member benefits, including access to wellness centers, dozens of classes and support from trained staff. Sizzlin' Summer Passes are on sale through August.

"Family budgets are tight and we're sensitive to economic conditions. That's why we made this year's Sizzlin' Summer Pass good for four months from the purchase date, rather than three," said Lubbe. "It's a super value for families who want to cool off in a safe place, get active and spend quality time together."

The YMCA's three water parks are open from May 29 through September 4. Water parks are open to the public, and the daily cost without membership is \$4 per person.
